Owl Moon Figurative Language

Figurative language can include metaphors, similes, and personification.

Similes compare two things that are not alike by using the words *like* or *as*. Example: A train whistle blew, long and low, *like a sad, sad song*.

Metaphors compare two opposite things without using *like* or *as*. Example: *The moon made his face into a silver mask*.

Personification is when you apply human attributes to an object that is not human. Example: My short, round shadow *bumped after me*.
